BEING

1 John 3:1-3 - See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. And everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure.

On Sunday, May 28th, the St. Paul Bishop Bible Class started our study of Article 4 of the Augsburg Confession. I understand that not everyone who reads this article will attend or is able to attend this class, but the discussions that we are going to have over the next couple weeks are of extreme importance. Luther referred to this article as the one "on which the church stands or falls." What is the topic of this article? It is justification by grace, through faith.

What does this mean? Put simply, we confess that when it comes to our salvation, God does everything. When we were dead in our sins, unable to approach God, much less appease Him, He came to us. This started in the Garden of Eden, when God sacrificed an animal to cover the shame of his people, and this sacrifice made its ultimate fulfillment in Jesus. When we owed God our very lives for our sins, God sent His Son Jesus to give his life up for us. On account of this sacrifice, we are pleasing to God. On account of this sacrifice, we get to be called his children.

Just like the natural children of human beings do not become children of their own wills, but because of the relationship they have with their parents, our relationship as the children of God is not based on anything that we do. Children do not give anything to their parents to make them children. Children do not do anything for their parents to make them children. Children do not say magic words to their parents to make them children. They are children because of the love and the declaration of the parents.

The children of God cannot give anything to become the children of God. The children of God cannot do anything to become the children of God. The children of God cannot say magic words or incantations to become the children of God. They are His children because he has declared them to be so through the life, death, and resurrection of His Son.

This means that the first and only thing that a Christian needs to "DO" is to BE. There are things that Christians DO because they ARE Christians, but the thing that gives them their identity is the declaration of God. And this is a very good thing.

This is a very good thing because when God is responsible for our identity, then our burdened consciences can be at peace. If we had to do, give, or say something to be God's children then we could never be truly sure that we were saved. However, when who we are is fully reliant on who he is, then we can rest assured in his perfect ability to create what is pleasing to him. And He does create what is pleasing to him in Word, in water, in body, and in blood.

The practical implications for this, I will leave for next month's newsletter article where I will talk about the Christian life. Until then, please BE God's people. Come to church where your pastor and your fellow Christians will remind you of who you have been made in Christ Jesus. Rejoice and be at peace, knowing that God is pleased to call you His. Amen.

LWML MONTHLY MINUTES

The LWML of St. Paul Lutheran Church- Bishop, held its monthly meeting Monday, May 1, 2023. The meeting was held in the church conference room/ chapel and called to order at 2:00 pm. Six members were present. Topic meeting was led by Marilyn Moerbe and titled " Mirror, Mirror."

President Lowman welcomed all present. May had no birthdays to celebrate in our group. Minutes from the previous meeting in April, were approved as read. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$1,055.02. Communications included thank you notes from the food banks of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne.

<u>Committee Reports</u>- The month of April was the responsibility of the Dorcas Circle. Visiting the sick is the responsibility of the LWML for the month of May. Volunteers were encouraged to visit whoever they could.

LWML Mission Grant Goal is \$2,150,000. The goal has been met. As of 3/17, received \$2,353.030.33. Funds received over the goal are bumped up to next year's goal. Changing Lives-Christ-Centered materials in the Hmong Language \$70,208.

LWML TX District Mission Grant- For the Mission Goal of \$390,000, as of March 31, recieved \$189,200.75. Prayer: Bible Brigade, Lutheran Disaster Care-\$16,000.

Ingathering will be hygiene items for the store visitors: toothbrushes, toothpaste, shower gel or bar soap, deodorant, shampoo/conditioner, combs, small tissue pack. At the event, hygiene kits will be assembled for the store. If anyone would like to contribute items, please have in church office by Sunday, May 7 at noon.
