Dear Fellow Redeemed:

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, who was and who is and who is to come. Amen.

This is how I begin official letters from Mt. Olive Lutheran Church. I didn't come up with

this. In fact, I acquired it creatively from the now sainted Rev. Dr. Herbert Mueller, the president of the Southern Illinois District at the time. I always liked these words. Here lately, these words have come to mean a lot. They tell of our Lord Jesus Christ who has redeemed us with His blood. They tell that He is indeed our Master. These words tell that He does not change from age to age. They tell us of His appearing in glory on the Last Day.

My high school days were in the 1970s – I graduated in 1978. I remember the advent of disco music. Yes, I even had a leisure suit! From my college days, I also remember the popularity wave of country music and the large dance halls patterned after Gilley's in Houston. Yes, I had Tony Llama boots, too, but no big hat. I recall a lot of tragedies, too: the explosion of the space shuttle Challenger, Operation Desert Shield and Storm

(I was a participant), September 11, 2001, the crash of the space shuttle Columbia, events.

In the 1990s, I recall Desert Storm. I met my wife. Two of my children were born. I was

ordained into the office of the Holy Ministry. There are lots of changes in life over the past 60+ years. I'm sure many of you remember a lot more changes and experiences. What has not changed is this. Our Lord Jesus Christ is true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and true Man, born of the Virgin Mary. He is our Lord, the one who has redeemed us, purchased and won us from all sin, from death, and from the power of the devil with His holy, precious blood and His innocent suffering and death. On the third day, He rose from the dead and today His tomb remains empty. He ascended into heaven where He rules over all things. On the Last Day He will come in glory and bring to all those who believe in Him resurrection life. None of this has changed since day Jesus ascended into heaven.

Thus, the promise of your Baptism remains just as true today as it did on the day it happened. The word of forgiveness pronounced in the Divine Service, as it enters your ear holes, gives to you what it says it gives: forgiveness by the authority of Christ. When you come to the Lord's table, you receive the true body and blood of your Lord Jesus Christ, just as He promised.

Lots of changes. Things in this world break. People in this world die. In the past eight years, I've been saddened by the death of my father and my brother. Yet, I praise God for our Lord Jesus who does not change. Thus, the promise of their baptism gives me hope of their own resurrection.

Though the church faces many challenges, though our individual congregations face many challenges, our Lord does not change. His ways are not our ways, and what we desire may not be what He had planned. Still, we trust our Lord Jesus, for He is our peace (Ephesians 2:14).
