# WILLING HEARTS MONTHLY MINUTES

The Willing Hearts of St. Paul Lutheran Church-Bishop, met on Wednesday, August 6, 2025, at 2:00 PM. at the Dairy Queen for our monthly meeting. President Kathy Lowman welcomed the 7 members present, and called the meeting to order. The minutes of the previous June meeting were not read; there was no meeting in July.

TREASURER'S REPORT: JoAnn Denkeler reported on the checking account and savings account balances. A detailed financial report is attached to the minutes. She also stated we will no longer be receiving paper statements.

COMMUNICATIONS: Kathy stated we received the following items: information for LWML Sunday; a letter of request from Concordia Seminary to Adopt a Student; and information from Upbring. COMMITTEE REPORTS: Visit the Sick—no report. Kitchen—a report. Flower Chart—no report.

LWML NATIONAL MISSION GOAL: \$2,622,270; Mission Walk donations—\$105,590.73. There were 33 grants approved at the national convention.

LWMLTX DISTRICT MITE GOAL: \$403,000. Mission Grant Goal—\$272,314 (includes the abundance of \$47,314 from 2022-2024). Mites received through June 25, 2025—\$228,711.43.

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

LWML Convention — Carolyn Faske reported on the LWML Convention she attended in Omaha, NB. Organizations Merge and Bylaws — Kathy reported all paperwork is complete; the bylaws are in, and waiting on new charter.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

LWR — Collection for quilts and Personal Care Kits from this area is scheduled on Tuesday, November 4 th at Trinity Our Savior-CC. Upon request from a member, the required list of items for one (1) Personal Care kit was provided (1 dark color bath towel, 1 soft adult toothbrush, 1 wide-tooth comb, 1 nail clipper with file, 2 bars bath soap.) The LWR collections will be delivered to St. John Lutheran-Marion, TX. There was a discussion to give a donation to the Zone for travel expenses; no definite decision was made. At our October meeting we will need to set a date for the blessing of LWR quilts and kits, and a date to box these items for shipping.

Zone Executive Board — Kathy reported a meeting was held on July 26th at St. Paul Kingsville. The Fall Event will be Sunday, October 5 th at St. Paul-Kingsville. Ingathering items for the Purple Door of Kingsville will be listed with the invitation.

Nominating Committee — members are: Laura Lopez, Carolyn Faske, Beth Walker; they are seeking candidates for VP of Servant Resources (1), Treasurer (1), and Secretary (2).

Remembering 9/11 — Plans are to honor our local first responders with bagged cookie treats from the Willing Hearts group. Ten (10) members will each bake 3 dozen cookies. Marilyn Moerbe will get the bags and print the tags. We decided to move our next meeting to Wednesday, September  $10^{th}$ , and also bag the cookies for delivery on 9/11.

Pastor's Installation — Willing Hearts will provide the altar flowers. Colors will be red and white flowers. JoAnn will check with florist about using red gladiolas. Decided on a \$75 arrangement. Funeral Luncheon —Willing Hearts members planned the menu for 40-50, and will provide the food to serve the family and friends of LaDonna Zoch Bishop on Saturday, August 9 th.

# **BURNING BUSH**

In Exodus 3, God speaks to Moses from a bush that is burning but not consumed. When Moses asks what he should say if the Egyptians questions who sent him to lead the Israelites out of slavery, God states, "I AM WHO I AM." Centuries later, when people wonder who Jesus



is, his answers hint at his divinity: "I AM the light of the world; I AM the good shepherd; I AM the bread of life" and, perhaps most profoundly, "Before Abraham was, I AM" (John 8:58). On Pentecost, God's Holy Spirit comes upon the apostles as fire. Thus the burning bush is a powerful symbol of God's presence echoed through time.
