REPORT FROM WILLING HEARTS (lwml)

The Willing Hearts of St. Paul Lutheran Church-Bishop, met for our monthly meeting on Wednesday, October 1, 2025, at 2:00 PM in the Conference Room. President Kathy Lowman called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone in attendance. Carolyn Faske presented the topic, "Sharing Our Gifts as We Work for the Lord". Happy Birthday was sung to JoAnn Denkeler for her October 17th birthday.

ROLL CALL AND MINUTES: There were 9 members present and 1 guest. Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: JoAnn Denkeler reported the balances on our checking account and the savings account. A detailed financial report is attached to the minutes.

COMMUNICATIONS: a request from Samaritan's Purse to soliciting help with their Operation Christmas Child giftfilled shoeboxes for delivery to children in need; Kathy stated the Willing Hearts charter was received.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Visit the Sick—discussed what we could do since no visits were being made; Kitchen—Carolyn stated the freezer needs defrosting; Flower Chart—October 12th is open. LWML NATIONAL MISSION GOAL (2025-2027): \$2,622,270. No mite report or mission grant information available. LWML TX DISTRICT MITE GOAL (2024-2026): \$403,000. Mites received through August 2025–\$253,763.92. Mission grant: Investing in Future Generations—scholarships for Central Texas Lutheran Schools—\$25,000 will be distributed to—Redeemer-Austin, Faith H.S.-Warda, Zion-Walburg, St. Paul-Thorndale, Concordia H.S.-Pflugerville. The prayer for the Lutheran Schools was read by Kathy.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

9/11 Memorial Event — Members made over 300 cookies and bagged them after our September meeting. Cookies were delivered by Marilyn Moerbe to EMS in Driscoll, by Kathy to Nueces County Constables, by JoAnn to Bishop PD, and by Carolyn to Bishop Fire Station. Rummage Sale — Profit made was \$278. Items reserved for Orphan Grain Train were double bagged, protected by mouse and roach traps, and will be picked up in December. Other remaining items from sale were taken to Goodwill. Two cubbies were set beside the road and disappeared. The exercise bike, and the wooden bookcases/cubby were left in the Parish Hall and/or the breezeway. Advertising suggestions for the next rummage sale: Facebook, flyers, sign in church yard a week before, signs on street corners.

Fall Event — St. Paul-Kingsville will host the Fall Event on Sunday, October 5 th, with registration at 2:00 PM and the meeting at 2:30 PM. The theme is "Fall in Love with Jesus." Guest speaker will be from the Purple Door in Corpus Christi. Ingathering gifts requested are full-size toiletry items, and/or gift cards for purchase of children's necessities. Pastor Thierfelder will have the opening devotion. LWML Sunday (10/5) — JoAnn ordered the altar flowers and will pick them up on Saturday. Yolanda volunteered to take a vase to HEB. LWML Sunday materials will be used and will include the Blessing of LWR items. Moved the quilts and kits into church before our meeting.


